Application for Individual Papers: Instructions

If you would like to submit a paper referring to the conference theme ‘**Passion, Love and Sexuality in Psychoanalysis**’ see the EPF website for guidance, where you will find the subject, which gives details on the conference theme.

EPF welcomes also psychoanalytic works on any topic for submission and for eventual debate at the conference.

What is required

To consider your application we require:

- a completed application form
- an abstract (1800 letters) and
- a complete version of your paper (8-12 pages, maximum 21.600 letters)

Applications, abstracts and papers must be typed (Arial 12, single-spaced, no handwriting is accepted) in one of the EPF languages: English, French or German. It is strictly requested that papers have to be submitted in the language they will be presented at the Conference. The abstracts have to be presented in English, and if you wish, in a second language.

Completing the form

Please be careful to fill in all requested information on the application form.

Papers for the Theme section and papers for the Work in Progress section will be handled separately, so please indicate clearly on the form which section your paper is intended for.

The abstract

The abstract - if the paper is accepted at peer review - will serve as an advertisement for your presentation on the EPF website and in the Conference Programme. It is therefore important that abstract and title are clearly written and that they provide as much information as possible on what the paper is about.

Deadline for submissions

The deadline for the submission of abstracts and papers (they should be sent together) is **31st October 2009**. However, it is advantageous to submit earlier: the abstract will be posted on the EPF web-site as soon as the paper is accepted by peer review.

Peer-review

Submissions will be peer-reviewed according to the following criteria: quality of argument, degree of analytical depth and if the argument sounds interesting for the audience.

If your paper is accepted

Papers given in English attract a larger audience but it is possible to present in any of the three EPF languages. It will not be possible to provide simultaneous translation for these events. The number of participants attending an individual paper at the EPF conferences can vary. The Scientific Committee will choose your time slot for presentation.

Sessions

In general, there will be 2 individual paper presentations per session, chaired by a member of the EPF.

Length of final paper

Your paper should not exceed 12 pages (21.600 letters). The time allocated for the presentation will be 30 minutes, with roughly 30 minutes added for debate.
